Record warmth for December

What a December it has been. Did you realize we just came off the warmest December in El Paso history? You'll see from the graphic that we only had a couple of days where temperatures were below normal. There were two days when we had near-average results. The big event was this: we had six days where we set record highs, including Christmas Day, when we hit the all-time high for that day at 76, beating the old record of 75.

Besides setting the record for December, 2025 was the third hottest in El Paso's history. We were just behind 2023 and 2024 for three years in a row of record heat.
